QUALIFICATIONS: Bachelors degree in Sociology, Social Work, Psychology, Gerontology, Anthropology, Political Science, History, Criminal Justice, Theology, Nursing, Counseling, or Education required; or qualification as a Mental Health Professional as defined by the PA Department of Public Welfare. Experience and knowledge of human service field preferred. Good community networking skills, public speaking skills and written and oral communication skills preferred. The crisis piece requires knowledge and application of professional lethality assessments; application of active listening skills to assess tone, affect, and other verbal cues; assessment for the presence of delusional or psychotic thought processes; assessment and determination of risk for children who may be in immediate physical danger due to child abuse, neglect, or sexual exploitation; determination of risk for elderly who may be in immediate danger; assessment for detoxification of addictive substances and approval for payment of services when appropriate; and assessment of adults with disabilities who may be in immediate physical danger and in need of adult protective services. Regular and predictable attendance is an essential function of this position.
